BEYOND THE SURFACE

HOW SINGLE-PIECE INFUSION (SPI) AND A VETERAN'S EYE ARE RAISING THE STANDARD

John Ratto has built boats for over 40 years, but when he first walked into the EdgeWater Boats factory in 2020, something stopped him cold.

It wasn't the size of the facility or the sleek lines of the models in production. It was the hull finish. Smooth, clean, reflective—like glass.

"It was a mirror," Ratto recalls. "I'd never seen anything like it. That was the moment I knew something special was happening here."

That "something" was Single Piece Infusion—SPI—a manufacturing process that would become the cornerstone of his work at EdgeWater. For Ratto, SPI isn't just a new method. It's the result of a lifetime spent chasing quality, refining technique, and raising the standard of what a boat can be.

From Lamination Floor to Leadership

Ratto started in 1984 as a 24-year-old laminator at Sea Ray's brand-new factory in Palm Coast, Florida. He still remembers that first day—how it felt to help launch a plant from the ground up, to roll resin across glass for the first time. Boatbuilding wasn't just a job. It became a calling.

Over the years, he rose steadily through the ranks—Sea Ray, Boston Whaler, Everglades, Brunswick Commercial & Government Products. He led teams, overhauled production lines, and guided boats through the intense scrutiny of military contracts and government bids. He became a subject matter expert, a go-to for solving problems on the fly and producing strong, seaworthy vessels under pressure.

But no matter how far he moved up, lamination was always home.

And SPI? That was the future.





What Makes SPI Different

In traditional builds, hulls and internal structures are laid up in separate steps. SPI does it all at once—infusing the stringers and hull laminate in a single shot. That matters.

It potentially eliminates secondary bond issues. It creates a stronger, lighter hull with no voids and no weak links.

"Everything's pre-cut, pre-measured. Resin content is controlled. You get repeatable quality every single time," Ratto says. "It's not just better for the boat—it's better for the people building it."

Because the process is done under vacuum, there are no resin fumes floating through the air, no oversaturation, no dripping mess. A cleaner process, a safer environment, and a happier team.

"Morale changes when people feel safe and proud of what they're making," he says.

There's a sustainability angle, too. With no pollutants escaping into the air, SPI has earned favor from environmental regulators like Florida's Department of Environmental Protection. And with no wood in the hull, there's zero risk of rot—another long-term win.

A Veteran's Eye for the Details

At EdgeWater, Ratto's title is Vice President of Operations and Engineering—but his real role is quality gatekeeper. He walks the floor daily, scanning hulls, checking lines, talking to teams. He knows what a good boat looks like. More importantly, he knows what a great one feels like. Some insider tips that he likes to offer are more than price and looks.

If you're in the market for a boat, stop and really look, he advises.

"Check hull sides for heat distortion, mold marks, or bulkhead print through. If is caulk used, does it look clean with straight beads? Is the hardware flush, cleanly installed, and checked for burred screws? Have the hatches been opened to visually inspect whether the laminate is smooth and free of rough edges? If accessible, check to see if wiring is neatly bundled? Stand at the helm and ask, 'are the electronics straight, clean, and ergonomically located?' These are the tells."

For Ratto, these aren't small details. They're the signature of a well-built vessel. And at EdgeWater, they're non-negotiable.

More Than a Process—A Philosophy

SPI may be the technical backbone of EdgeWater's hulls, but it's the culture of the factory that brings it to life. For Ratto, that starts with cleanliness.

"Housekeeping matters," he says. "A clean factory builds a clean boat. It's that simple. Start with the floor. Start with pride."

That mindset flows through every department—from lamination to final rigging—and it's part of what makes EdgeWater different, he says. It's why he's excited about the new 25 and 31 models coming down the line. And it's why, after four decades in boatbuilding, Ratto is still excited to come to work.

The Finish That Says It All

Ratto doesn't often slow down. But when he walks

past a finished EdgeWater hull, he still pauses. And he still sees the same thing he saw that first day.

"SPI makes it possible," he says. "But it's not just the process. It's the people. The discipline. The pride. That's what gives these boats their finish. That's what makes them EdgeWater."



Built Better All at Once

THE SECRET BEHIND OUR STRENGTH: SINGLE-PIECE INFUSION

At EdgeWater Boats, we're committed to building The Better Boat—and a boat brand with such a braggadocious tagline must deliver on far more than premium seat cushions.

We do.

It all begins with the foundation of any boat—the hull. EdgeWater infuses every hull over 23 feet. You might ask, *why is Single-Piece Infusion the way to build The Better Boat?*

Let's break it down.

The process starts with spraying the gelcoat, which gives each boat its color. Then, hundreds of individually cut fiberglass pieces are carefully laid over the gelcoat in predetermined spots. Working in conjunction with the stringer system, this forms the medium through which resin will flow to create a single-piece hull.

Next comes the magic: we enclose the mold and fiberglass layers in a plastic bag and vacuum out all the air. EdgeWater pulls 30 inhg (vacuum) for two to five hours, depending on the part, at which point the infusion begins. The time required depends on factors like hull size and temperature.

Once the target negative pressure is reached, resin mixed with a preset amount of catalyst is drawn into the mold. The resin penetrates the fiberglass and stringer system, forming a fully infused single-piece hull.

Controlling the resin's flow is critical. While it takes hours to pull air from the bag, resin infusion into an EdgeWater hull takes just 20–30 minutes. And whether it's our

brand-new 250CC or our perennial best-seller, the 340CC, the process ensures the same consistency every time.

That consistency is a huge advantage. For example, our 262 Dual Console and 262 Center Console models each use about 600 pounds of resin, with a variance of no more than 15 pounds per hull. By contrast, before our Single-Piece Infusion process was invented, a 26-foot boat could vary by as much as 600 pounds from one build to another—a discrepancy most manufacturers simply accept with traditional fiberglass layup techniques.

At EdgeWater Boats, there is no such thing as a bad boat.

Historically, many builders used wood in their hulls, decks, and transoms. At EdgeWater, we do not. Instead, we use coosa board in our transoms and foam fiberglass-reinforced plastic stringers. Unlike wood, these materials don't rot or absorb water, which means your boat won't gain weight over time or weaken structurally. That's why every EdgeWater is built with no wood in the hull, transom, or deck—ensuring your boat stays rot-free for life.

Finally, once the infused part reaches ambient temperature—a process that can take up to 24 hours—the hull can be released from the mold.

It's this strict adherence to our build process that guarantees consistency in every EdgeWater hull—and gives us the confidence to back each one with a lifetime warranty.

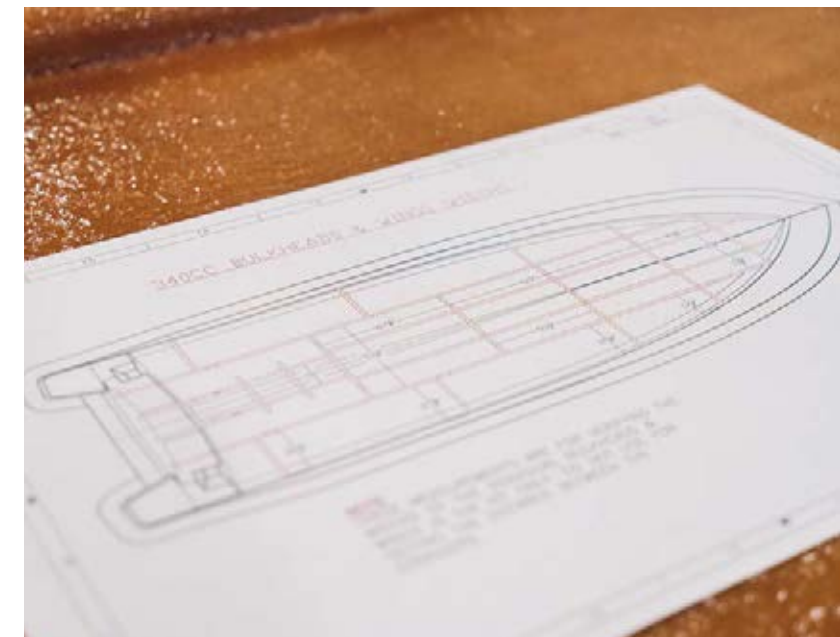

For 370CC owner Jeff Ragovin, loyalty to EdgeWater Boats is rooted in the brand's ability to strike the perfect balance between sophistication and versatility. What drew him in years ago—and has kept him coming back ever since—is what he describes as the "crossover appeal."

EdgeWater, Ragovin explains, builds vessels that are both serious, capable fishing machines and comfortable, stylish pleasure boats. "Whether I'm heading offshore at sunrise or cruising with friends at sunset, I know I'm in a boat that's built for both performance and enjoyment," he says. To him, it's that rare combination of rugged utility and refined comfort that sets EdgeWater apart.



The Model That Sealed the Deal

For Ragovin, the 370 with the tower “absolutely sealed the deal.” A serious offshore angler, he wanted a boat with the height and visibility a tower provides. “There’s nothing like being up there spotting busting tuna from a distance,” Ragovin recalls. But what impresses him just as much is how that same tower transforms the experience while cruising. “The elevated view gives you a whole new perspective, whether you’re running the coast or pulling into a quiet harbor,” he says. Equipped with triple 300 Yamahas, the 370 delivers all the speed and power he needs—whether chasing fish offshore or simply chasing the horizon.

At Modern Yachts, Sales Manager Matt Levy remembers that moment well when he introduced him to the model. “From the day Jeff took the helm of his 370CC, it was clear he wasn’t simply buying a boat—he was embracing a lifestyle,” Levy says. “His passion for offshore fishing, especially tuna, found its perfect partner in EdgeWater’s capability. And truth be told, he’s taken that boat right to its limits, and maybe a little beyond.”

A Boat That Matches His Lifestyle

That dual-purpose nature—rugged and refined—has made EdgeWater a seamless fit in Ragovin’s lifestyle. On one hand, it’s a hardcore fishing platform capable of running 70+ miles offshore with the performance, range, and stability needed for long days on the water. On the other, it’s comfortable and thoughtfully designed, making it just as perfect for anchoring at a sandbar, cruising the coastline, or entertaining friends.

“It’s that balance that makes EdgeWater such a great fit,” Ragovin says. “Whether I’m geared up for a full day offshore or just heading out for a sunset cruise, the boat always delivers.”

Levy says that balance is precisely what keeps customers returning to EdgeWater. “That distinctive ride is what hooks people. Some of our owners are on their second, third, even fourth EdgeWater,” he explains. “The confidence kicks in the moment you throttle up. Doesn’t matter if you’re piloting a 248CX on a quiet bay or pushing a 370CC offshore into less-than-ideal seas—these boats just track true. They carve, glide, and hold steady in a way that’s hard to explain until you’ve felt it yourself.”



Unforgettable Experiences

For Ragovin, EdgeWater has delivered unforgettable days offshore. "Out there, it's a different world," he says. "I've had humpbacks surface yards from the bow, dolphins riding the wake, and tuna lighting up the spread."

Levy says new owners often notice how grounded an EdgeWater feels from the first ride. "It doesn't skitter across the water or throw you around—it slices through chop like it's nothing. And when the situation calls for a tight turn or a quick course correction, the boat answers instantly. That comes down to thoughtful hull design, smart weight distribution, and EdgeWater's SPI construction process, which gives the entire platform real backbone. You can feel it underfoot, in the ride, in the way the boat behaves. In a word: predictable. And boaters, no matter their level of experience, want a boat that responds with predictability and safety."

Confidence in Rough Seas

That predictability proved itself when Ragovin was caught in a fast-moving offshore storm. "Big swells, heavy wind, water breaking over the bow—it was one of those days where conditions changed fast," he says. Yet the EdgeWater 370 never faltered. "The hull handled the rough seas confidently, and the boat kept its footing through it all."

What stood out most was comfort. "Having hot water, heat, and a generator made a huge difference. We were wet and tired, but we stayed warm,

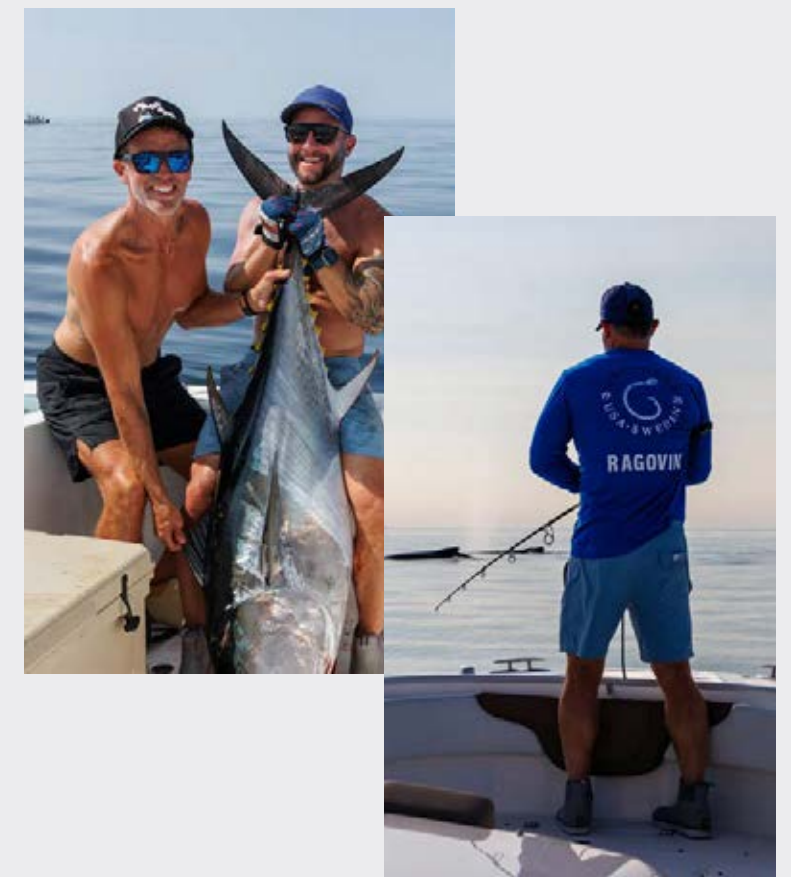
had power, and made it back to port knowing we were in good hands," Ragovin recalls.

That's why EdgeWater sells itself, Levy says. "We're not pitching fairy tales—people feel the difference on the water. Once they do, EdgeWater seals the deal. It's that rare mix of performance, balance, and reliability that makes it The Better Boat."

Expanding Horizons

For Ragovin, owning an EdgeWater has "expanded the map." Offshore runs once limited by range now feel routine. "Running 75 miles offshore has opened a whole new world of fishing grounds, wildlife encounters, and cruising destinations," he explains.

Levy calls it the essence of EdgeWater ownership. "Jeff embodies the spirit of adventure these boats are built for," he says. "Whether launching out of Montauk or creating content for *Bounty Uncharted*, he shows people what these boats can do—and where they can take you."





The New Addition

THE PERRY FAMILY GROWS — NOT JUST ON THE WATER.

For Jennifer and Todd Perry, life on the water has always been second nature. Their journey with EdgeWater Boats began with the nimble 158CS, a small but capable center console that carried them from riverside runs to offshore adventures. "She may be little, but she is fierce," Jennifer says. The 158CS handled like no other in its class, feeling larger than its size, and quickly became part of their family's lifestyle.

As the years went on, the Perrys found themselves ready to go farther. They moved up to a 245CC—a boat that became their everything platform. With twin Yamaha 150s, the 245 delivered comfort, fishability, and reliability for long days on the water, whether cruising

But their story didn't end there. With Bahamas crossings in mind and a growing family, the Perrys decided to go even bigger—this time with a semi-custom 325CC. Working closely with their dealership and EdgeWater's factory, the process was smooth, transparent, and personal. The result was a boat that not only met but exceeded their expectations.

Today, their 325CC has proven itself in every condition. Its dry, confident ride inspires peace of mind offshore, while

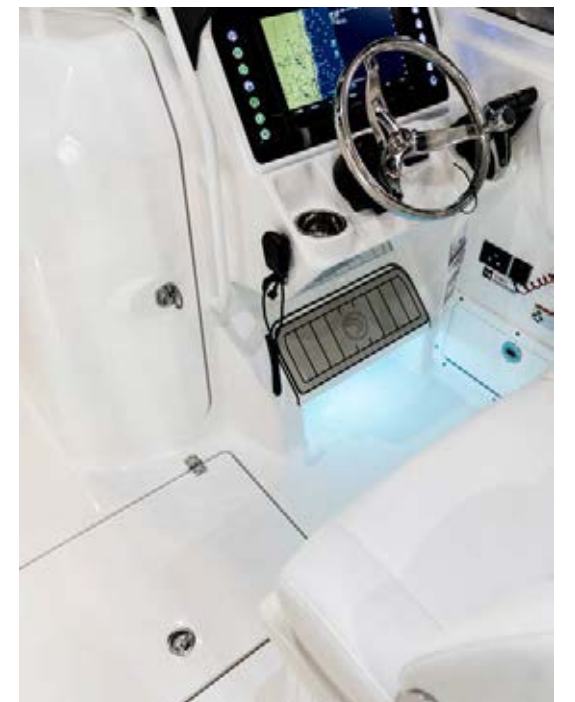
